Subsidized Visiting Elective Program (SVEP)

The Office of Minority Physician Recruitment at Boston Medical Center affiliate teaching hospital of Boston University School of Medicine is now accepting applications for their Subsidized Visiting Elective Program (SVEP). **Application Deadline April 20th 2018**

The Subsidized Visiting Elective Program allows qualified 4th year medical students that are considering applying to one of Boston University Medical Center's residency programs the opportunity to get hands-on experience and exposure to our clinical services and diverse patient population during a month long elective.

What are the benefits?

- Accepted students will be reimbursed up to \$2,000 for travel, housing, and VSLO application fee.
- Receive clinical education in most of our specialties at Boston's largest safety net hospital which serves the city's most diverse patients.
- Networking opportunities with URM faculty, residents, and fellows.
- Opportunity to explore the city of Boston.

Who is Eligible to apply?

- Currently enrolled full-time 3rd year medical students applying to senior electives.
- Good academic standing at a LCME accredited institution.
- Individuals belonging to a group considered under-represented in medicine (Black/African-American, Hispanic/Latino, Native American, and Pacific Islander/Native Hawaiian)
- US Citizens or permanent resident
